David Starling, NT lecturer at Morling college, will be preaching & exploring 1 Corinthians 7 to help us become the alternative witnesses this world yearns to see.

Sometimes we let a good thing become bad.

Work, for example, is good. It's good to be productive, using our skills and effort to contribute to the wider good. It can provide an income and a sense of purpose. However, if it takes priority over other important things it can lead to broken relationships, broken health and maybe losing our way spiritually. Then it's bad.

I'm sure you can think of your own examples where we can let a good thing become bad.

Today as we look at Matthew 22:34-40, we see that this is what the Pharisees did with God's Law, back in the time of Jesus. The Law was good, given by God so his people would know how to live as his people, with righteousness, justice and mercy. Yet they had turned it into a means to earn merit, a source of pride, and in this interaction with Jesus, they'd turned it into a weapon. They'd made a good thing bad.

Jesus, in answering them, took them back to the fundamental things – love God and love your neighbour.

Let's take the time to reflect on where we might have turned good things bad, in our personal lives, and perhaps even as a church. Let's hear Jesus' call to come back to the most important things – to love God and love our neighbour.
