Our Nation and our First Nation
People have just celebrated

Reconciliation Week. It is twenty years

since the iconic Reconciliation Walk across Sydney Harbour
Bridge. The organisers stating, "Our hope is for a united

Australia that respects this land of ours; values the Aboriginal
and Torres Strait Islander heritage; and provides justice and

equity for all". **While the question of how to continue to move
towards reconciliation is nuanced, several things are clear.**

1) God declares all peoples as being created in his image and as
precious to him. **2) God calls us to unity**, and this is in line with

part of our Church's Mission Statement. **3) The Bible teaches us**
about compassion for the vulnerable. **With these in mind** our

Catalyst team recognise the positive intent and inclusiveness of
Acknowledgement of Country (Psalm 82:3-3, Micah 6:8). It does

not have to be done by an indigenous person. **The Catalyst team**
would ask that you please consider and pray on this

matter as these issues are currently in the news.

Please note that an acknowledgment of Country is different to
Welcome to Country which is an invitation by the people of that
particular tribal area (to ask permission) to enter and promise to
respect the land you are entering from an elder of that land.
