How do you deal with unanswered prayer? It can be hard to know what to think, if the thing we're praying for seems very much like something we'd expect that God would want. Do we need to pray harder or longer? Or to use the right words, a special prayer perhaps?

Today we turn to 1 Samuel 4. Here Israel find themselves in a situation where God doesn't give them the victory in battle that they think he should give them. Their response is to get the ark of the covenant, representing God's promises and presence among them, and to take it into the next battle. Surely, they think, God will give us the victory. But of course, that's not what happens. God has other plans – in this case to keep his word and punish them for their disobedience.

There are many reasons why God may not answer our prayers in the way we think he should, but above all, this story reminds us that we need to remember he is God, not us. He can't be 'put in a box' and manipulated to do what we think he should do. Yes he invites us to take our desires to him in prayer & he loves to give us good things, just like Hannah in chapter 1, but there's no guarantee that he'll do what we think he should do, and we must always retain a posture of humility that shows itself in trusting obedience.

The 2020 Ethical Fashion Guide

Later this month, Peter Keegan from Baptist World Aid (BWA) will be sharing with us about some of what BWA have been up to over the past few months. Each year a team releases research grading clothing companies based on how ethical their supply chains are. This year however, like many things, the ordinary approach to this project has needed to adapt. In the global fashion supply chain, the pandemic has exaggerated longstanding concerns around wages, worker health & safety, & labour rights. While these issues are not new, they have been magnified by this global emergency. And that means the daily risks faced by the garment workers who make our clothes, have massively increased. With this increased vulnerability, & clothing companies here facing their own challenges as sales slow down, BWA have refined their approach, & invited companies to prioritise 6 key areas. These commitments seek to protect the lives and livelihoods of those most at risk in companies' supply chains. For more information visit...
