Have you come across the idea that in the Old Testament God is a holy God of justice who demands people obey his laws if they want to be accepted by him (and is sometimes quite oppressive and horrible) ...in contrast to the New Testament where God has changed the way he relates to people, having become a loving God of grace who sent Jesus so we could be forgiven?

This is partly because of stories like in 1 Samuel 4-6 which show the fearsome power of God that can't be manipulated or defied and which leaves even his own people asking 'What will we do with the power of God?'(6:20)

One problem with this view is that God appears fickle. It's a major change – so can God really be trusted now to be gracious and forgiving? Another problem is we might find ourselves feeling embarrassed about big parts of the Bible especially in the Old Testament that don't seem to fit our preferred version of God.

Today we open up 1 Samuel 7 where we are reminded that God has always been a holy God whose power and judgment is to be feared, but he's also always been a loving God who graciously rescues those who cry out to him and put their trust in him. Always. And it matters that we understand this, because *it's only then that we begin to grasp the depth and wonder of his grace.*

### **Justice Spot**

Later this month Lyn Kidson will be sharing a small part of her years of research & reflections on the theology of the new testament, and what this has to offer the topic of domestic & family violence in the modern world. As statistics increasingly confront our societies, our justice system, & our churches...statistics like, the number one cause of homelessness for women in Australia is due to domestic & family violence...how do we respond? This issue is complex, yet there is consensus that a major factor driving this reality are different forms of gender inequality. As Christians, we hold that men & women were created in God's image...created to portray His character, & to enact His good purposes. How do we as men and women of God depict the kind of peace we say is available through knowing Jesus? How ought the church respond to a hurting world? Lyn will explore these ideas, in light of Matthew's gospel...specifically Matt 5:5 and Matt 14:1-12. Approaching these realities will take patience, humility, creativity, generosity, & prayer. If this topic is something you would like our church to explore in 2021, there are organisations planning to address this, so please speak to a pastor about getting involved.
