### Mission Spot— Wycliffe (Natalie & James Nelson)



In the PNG clinic (Ukarumpa) they have a new testing machine (GeneXpert) used alongside the rapid antigen testing that enables accurate and timely COVID-19 results. They are thankful for God's provision and the generosity of Dr Steven Badman and Professor Andrew Vallely from the Kirby institute (affiliated with Uni of NSW) who donated thousands of dollars worth of quality control material, to ensure the highest standard of testing.

James and Natalie often help load much needed supplies to PNG when taking a much needed break from language studies. Nat has also been doing additional work in the lab in Cairns where she says she is being stretched. Thankfully they are not in lockdown at the moment so are able to keep supply lines between PNG open with certain government dispensations.

All the logistical requirements keep changing. However in the last few months another Bible translator made it back to PNG, a nurse has made it back from PNG and 2 families made it back from Asia to Australia. Another has made it as far as New Zealand but can hopefully get back here in the next few months.

Be encouraged that the work of translation continues despite the added challenges. The Word of God continues to go out into His world to transform lives.

### Church Gatherings in NSW

As a church community, one thing is certain, we are one week closer to the easing of Covid restrictions and the ability to gather together as a church.

That being said, there is still uncertainty as to what that "gathering" will look like.

The Baptist Association, together with other religious organisations continues to lobby the NSW Gov as they plan the "road map out of Covid".

What is clear is that we will not be returning to what we were experiencing prior to the most recent lockdown.

Face masks, QR Codes, no singing, the 4 sq metre rule will be in place - with the likelihood of some kind of vaccination check/passport.

As a staff we have already started to have conversations regarding what is ahead - and particularly considering the viability of outside gatherings - however not enough information is available at present. We will keep you up to date as the picture becomes clearer.

### Our God – all knowing, all powerful, all present



This week we want to reflect on God who has perfect knowledge, perfect understanding, and perfect wisdom as to how to apply the knowledge.

Be encouraged to pray around the words from Psalm 139 1-6 - O LORD, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away. You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways. Even before a word is on my tongue, O LORD, you know it completely.
