

We have received some very helpful information and recommendations from the Baptist Association over the past week which helps us plan the return to in-person services over the next month. In Romans 8:25-27 Paul observes if we look forward to something we don't yet have, we must wait patiently and confidently. The Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness. For example, we don't know what God wants us to pray for. But the Holy Spirit prays for us with groanings that cannot be expressed in words. And the Father who knows all hearts knows what the Spirit is saying, for the Spirit pleads for us believers in harmony with God's own will. The Holy Spirit can help us through the 'waiting season'. When circumstances or pain leave us without words to pray, we have the Holy Spirit with us. He is our advocate. When we want to pray but we can't even put into words what is on our heart, the Holy Spirit can be our advocate. He knows our hearts and the situations that we are in.


HOPESTREET COLLECTIONS
