

and children escaping violence, people who need support with affordable food, or fair finance to replace a fridge or other essential appliances, and many others who have found themselves in crisis.

In the foyer are the latest copies of the BaptistCare Hope Street Newsletter with stories of hope from around NSW. Please take one and be prayerful for the wonderful work being done.

In May and June this year Hope Street in NSW saw 13,760 Community centre clients (over 200 people every day), 573 clients over the phone, assisted 4,413 people with food shopping, 5,675 food parcels distributed and provided 18,541 meals (1 meal every 5 minutes). They also provided services for 3,725 people sleeping rough.


#### 40 Days of Prayer—1 December to 9 January
